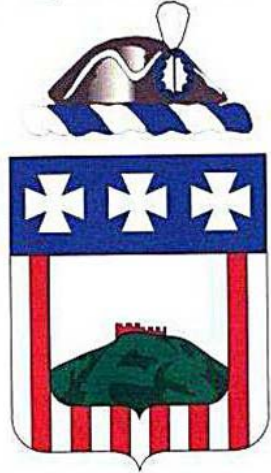

As a Sergeant he was Direct Commissioned to 2nd Lieutenant of Infantry while serving as one of LTG (retired) J.R. Vines' Gold Falcons in Iraq.

LTC Martinez has served in a variety of leadership, staff, and command positions to include: Rifleman, Team Leader, Squad Leader, Platoon Leader, Scout Platoon Leader, Brigade Adjutant, Battalion Operations Officer, three-time Company Commander, Military Assistant to the Deputy Secretary of Defense, Special Advisor and Staff Secretary to the Vice President, Battalion Executive Officer, Brigade Executive Officer, U.S. Senate Military Fellow, and Legislative Liaison for the Under Secretary of the Army. LTC Martinez has had the privilege of deploying to combat in support of operations in Panama, Saudi Arabia-Iraq, Iraq (OEF I), and Afghanistan (OEF V and VI).

LTC Martinez' education includes a BA in Political Science, an MA in Law and Economics, and a Juris Doctorate in Law. Additionally, he is a distinguished graduate of the Marine Corps Command and Staff College.

Command Sergeant Major (CSM) Maurice Jackson was born in Birmingham, Alabama. He enlisted as an Infantryman in September 1987 and has served in every leadership position in the NCO Corps from Team Leader to Battalion CSM. He has served in a variety of duty positions including Rifleman, Sniper and Master Gunner. In addition to his time as an infantryman, CSM Jackson has served as a Drill Instructor and as an instructor at the Noncommissioned Officer Academy (BNCOC).

CSM Jackson's military schools include: Bradley Master Gunner Course, Drill Sergeant, Airborne, Pathfinder, Battle Staff, First Sergeant Course, Master Fitness, and the Basic Instructor Course. CSM Jackson is a graduate of PLDC, BNCOC, ANCO and the Sergeants Major Academy. He holds a Bachelors of Science Degree in Basic Administration from Excelsior College.

- * **Inactivated 1 June 1941** at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri
- * **Activated 14 February 1942** in Newfoundland
- * **Inactivated 20 November 1946** in Germany
- * **Activated 6 April 1948** at Fort Myer, Virginia
- * **Inactivated 1 July 1957** at Fort Myer, Virginia; concurrently, redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 4th Battle Group, 3d Infantry

4TH BATTALION TASK ORGANIZATION

HEADQUARTERS COMPANY

HHC provides support to the battalion primarily through its staff and its combat command and control capability. Reactivated in December 2008, this 50 man company is responsible for the daily well-being of more than 900 Soldiers.

ALPHA COMPANY

Historically known as the Commander-in-Chief's Guard and is patterned after General George Washington's personal guard of that day. This MTOE Infantry Company conducts tactical training year round to sustain proficiency in its Rifle Company's tasks that support the 3d U.S. Infantry Regiment's (The Old Guard) mission to defend the National Capital Region, and deploy in support of GWOT.

ECHO COMPANY

Honor Guard Company executes Joint and Army ceremonies throughout the National Capital Region and Nation IOT maintain the traditions of the US Army, showcase the Army to our nations citizens and the world, and to defend the dignity and honor of our fallen comrades. Honor Company is a key asset in the conduct of State Funerals. This Infantry Company trains year round and is prepared to defend the Capital and deploy in support of GWOT. Honor Guard has two Specialty Platoons that include the Sentinels of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and the Continental Color Guard.

529TH SUPPORT COMPANY

529TH Regimental Support Company, 4th Battalion, 3d U.S. Infantry Regiment conducts Food Service, Maintenance, Transportation, Medical and Munitions support to all ceremonial, tactical, and combat missions.

289TH MILITARY POLICE COMPANY

The 289th MP Company and Military Working Dog (MWD) assets from the 947th MP Detachment conduct Law and Order Operations at Ft. Myer and Ft.
